A question that led to multiplication

Participating in our church planting residency program surrounded by like-minded missional leaders was deeply invigorating for Brett (Denver, CO), reassuring him that he wasn't alone in his vision. Recently he shared a powerful story about a 19-year-old named Alex who attended their service. Having been incarcerated multiple times, Alex recognized his life was off course and was actively seeking spiritual direction. Brett began meeting with Alex, who initially wrestled with what felt like insurmountable questions. However, as Brett presented the gospel, Alex reached a turning point: **"In light of who Jesus is, my questions don't even matter."** With that, Alex placed his trust in Jesus. Applying what he learned at our residency training, Brett immediately prompted him, **"Alex, who else needs to hear about this?"**

When Alex arrived for their first follow-up appointment the following week, he brought his friend Ethan. When Brett asked Ethan if he had heard the gospel, Ethan replied, "Yes, Alex shared it with me last week." Brett walked through the gospel message with him again on a napkin, and Ethan also put his faith in Jesus. As follow-up meetings continued over the next month, Alex invited his mother, his girlfriend, and Ethan, laying the foundation for a flourishing new missional community.

During our time there, we also visited several churches, Gabor preached multiple times, hosted evangelism and leadership trainings, and met with disciples we've been helping online who are envisioned to start new missional communities. We're encouraged by the ways God is continuing to work and multiply His Church.



Our time in Hungary also gave us a precious opportunity to be with our family. We were grateful to spend time with our children and granddaughter, and to help care for Edina's parents. These moments together were a meaningful gift in the midst of a full and fruitful summer.
